

ORDINANCE #I.5

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING TAMACOUNTY VOTING PRECINCTS

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Tama County, Iowa:

Section 1. Purpose: The purpose of this ordinance is to establish election precincts as the result of the population changes reflected by the 2020 federal decennial census, in accordance with Iowa Code Sections 331.210A and 49.7.

Section 2. Boundaries of Election Precincts: Tama County shall have thirteen (13) election precincts whose boundaries shall be as follows:

Precinct #1, LINCOLN/GRANT: Consist of all Lincoln and Grant Townships AND includes the City of Lincoln in Lincoln Township.

Precinct #2, BUCKINGHAM/PERRY: Consists of all Buckingham and Perry Townships AND includes the City of Traer in Perry Township.

Precinct #3, GENESEO/CLARK: Consists of all Geneseo and Clark Townships AND includes the City of Dysart in Clark Township.

Precinct #4, SPRING CREEK/CRYSTAL: Consist of all Spring Creek and Crystal Townships AND includes the City of Gladbrook in Spring Creek Township.

Precinct #5, CARLTON: Consists of all Carlton Township AND includes the City of Garwin.

Precinct #6, HOWARD/TOLEDO: Consists of all Howard and Toledo Townships EXCEPT that part lying within the Indian Settlement Trust Land in Toledo Townships AND includes the City of Toledo in Toledo Township.

Precinct #7, CARROLL/ONEIDA: Consists of all Carroll and Oneida Townships AND includes the City of Clutier in Oneida Township.

Precinct #8, HIGHLAND/INDIAN VILLAGE/COLUMBIA: Consists of all Highland, Indian Village and Columbia Townships EXCEPT that part lying within the Indian Settlement Trust Land in Highland, Indian Village and Columbia Townships AND includes the City of Montour in Indian Village Township.

Precinct #9, TAMA/OTTER CREEK: Consists of Tama and Otter Creek Townships EXCEPT that part lying within the Indian Settlement Trust Land in Tama Township AND includes the City of Tama.

Precinct #10, YORK: Consists of all York Township AND includes the Cities of Elberon and Vining.

Precinct #11, WEST RICHLAND: Consists of Richland Township Lying West of P Ave in Richland Township.

Precinct #12, EAST RICHLAND/SALT CREEK: Consists of Richland Township Lying East of P Ave and all of Salt Creek Townships AND includes the City of Chelsea in Salt Creek Township.

Precinct #13, INDIAN SETTLEMENT: Notwithstanding any other provision in the Code of Iowa, Indian Settlement land held in trust by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States for the Sac and Fox Tribe of the Mississippi in Iowa and its trust land contiguous to the Indian Settlement lying in Tama,

Toledo, Indian Village and Columbia townships of Tama county shall be an election precinct. The Indian Settlement precinct shall be redrawn to include land contiguous to the Indian Settlement when such land is purchased by the settlement and added to the Indian Settlement land held in trust by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States. Upon recording of the deed transferring the land to the United States in trust, the County Recorder shall notify the County Commissioner of that fact. If the Commissioner is notified more than seventy days before the next scheduled election, the Commissioner shall redraw the precinct for that election. The Commissioner shall notify the Board of Supervisors of the redrawn precinct boundaries and shall certify the redrawn boundaries to the State Commissioner. Land completely surrounded by the boundaries of the Indian Settlement precinct, but not included in the settlement precinct, shall be included in the precinct in which such land was located prior to redrawing of the Indian Settlement precinct. The Commissioner shall notify registered voters in each of the redrawn precincts of the change in the precincts and the proper polling place for those affected voters. [Pursuant to Chapter 49.7, Code of Iowa.]

Section 4. Effective Date: This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

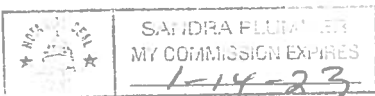

Precinct #12, EAST RICHLAND/SALT CREEK: Consists of Richland Township Lying East of P Ave and all of Salt Creek Townships AND includes the City of Chelsea in Salt Creek Township.

Precinct #4, SPRING CREEK/CRYSTAL: Consist of all Spring Creek and Crystal Townships AND includes the City of Gladbrook in Spring Creek Township.
